


Flag Ceremony





When is Scout Sunday 2018?

Scout Sunday is **Feb. 4, 2018**.

How did I know that? Scout Sunday is always held on the Sunday before the birthday of the Boy Scouts of America on Feb. 8.

(The only exception: when Feb. 8 falls on a Sunday, as happened in 2015. In that case, Scout Sunday and the BSA's birthday were both celebrated on Feb. 8.)

Though Feb. 4 is the official day for Scout Sunday 2018, each chartered organization may adopt any specific Sunday to celebrate. The BSA says a local church may celebrate "on the Sunday most acceptable to the pastor and congregation."

In the United Methodist Church, for example, the second Sunday in February is set aside for what the church calls Scouting Sunday. This year that's Feb. 11. This also happens to be the date on Council's website.

Away Camp Update

Good Morning,

We have reserved our away summer camp for this year. The Troop will be attending the Daniel Boone Summer Camp in North Carolina. We will be attending the camp the week of July 22-28, 2018. The base camp price per camper is \$335 with High Adventure options as much as \$525. High Adventure options are available to those scouts that have obtained a rank of 1st Class and are 13 years of age.

We will need to send in a 1/3 deposit for this by January 15th. So please go on to scout pay in the next few days and register. If this is an issue please talk with Mr. Williams, Mrs. Lange, Mr. Lange or Mr. Farrell at this week's Court of Honor. We want to make sure we are reserving enough spots for all scouts that are going.

We will be able to get a refund if you change your mind but that will have to be done by this April. So it is better to plan on going and reserve your spot now than to not have a spot.

For those scouts that want High Adventure we will not be able to reserve that spot till we pay a 1/3 total cost for the high adventure that you choose. Please visit the website below to review your options.

But who was Vivian Ferrin?

ABOUT VIVAN A. FERRIN
September 25, 1926 - January 4, 2004

Vivian Ferrin was born in Jamaica, West Indies, in 1926, migrating to New York as a young man to pursue his college education. After serving in the U.S. Army during the Korean War and gaining his U.S. citizenship in 1952, Vivian and his wife of 53 years, Adrienne, moved to Washington D.C. Here, Vivian completed his Bachelor's Degree in Political Science at Howard University and his Graduate Studies at George Washington University. Following a long career with the Department of State, as head of the U. S. Passport Agency in Washington D.C., he retired in 1986 and moved to The Village of Royal Palm Beach. The Agency, still needing his expertise, enticed Mr. Ferrin to stay another three years as a consultant thus commuting between Royal Palm Beach and Washington D.C.


Finally, in 1989, he became a full-time Floridian. It wasn't long before he began serving on the Royal Palm Beach Planning & Zoning Commission, the Community Revitalization Advisory Board and several community organization boards. Perhaps Vivian is best known as one of the founding members of the Caribbean-Americans for Community Involvement (CAFCI) where he served in many capacities, including President and Chairman of the Board. Among the numerous contributions he brought to the organization, the CAFCI Student Assistance Program, which continues today, was very important to him. He felt it was our obligation to reach out, encourage, and assist our youth in reaching their goals.

His activism led to an appointment to the Royal Palm Beach Village Council in 1998. He successfully defended his council seat in the 1998 and again in the 1999 elections. His health forced him to step down in 2003. The Caribbean community is very proud of this trailblazer, for he is one of the first Jamaicans to hold political office in South Florida.

When remembering him, these are some of the thoughts shared by those who knew him best. "Everyone loved his style, his dignity, his generosity, his caring for others and his sincere friendship." "Vivian was the type of government official we all want to represent us — one who is truly a public servant and not a politician; a man who truly cares about his community and serves with honor and integrity, putting others before himself." "The best way to honor him is by emulating some of his virtues in our own lives, virtues such as humility, frankness, generosity, honesty, loyalty, peacefulness, gentleness and a sincere caring for family, friends and the community." In May of 2006 the Village of Royal Palm Beach dedicated a park "*The Vivian A. Ferrin Memorial Park*" in honor his public service to the community. The park features three softball fields and two basketball courts for the youth in our community.

It is in this spirit that the *Vivian A. Ferrin Memorial Scholarship Fund* was created.

Summer Camp is Coming Get Registered and Get Merit Badges Selected

Thanks to Mr. Farrell, we have an explanation of the matrix! This information will be helpful for new scouts and their families. The matrix is attached to the email I sent out.

“I have attached a matrix to help pick your merit badge classes. There are 3 class periods a day. Some classes take up 2 of the classes spots per day. Some classes may only take up 1 class spot on Monday and Tuesday.

So for instance. Climbing is a 2 block class from 2 pm to 5 pm Monday through Thursday. You would then need to pick which classes would fill your Block 1 from 8:15-12:15 Monday - Thursday. That could be done with 1,2,3 or 4 classes depending on the how many blocks are needed to fill your schedule. Also classes are filling up so there could be availability issues.

Feel free to bring the matrix in with you to your next meeting to discuss any questions you may have. Remember a scout is prepared, so I would like to go over your predetermine choices. I will not have time to build a schedule with every scout if you have not done your research first.”



VFW Scholarship Opportunity for Eagles

Scout of the Year

WHO CAN ENTER

Scouts who are registered, active members of a Boy or Girl Scout Troop, Venturing Crew, or a Sea Scout Ship who have received the Eagle Scout Award, Girl Scout Gold Award, Venture Summit Award or Sea Scout Quartermaster Award.

Scouts must be 15 years of age and have demonstrated practical citizenship in school, scouting and the community.

Scouts must be enrolled in high school at the time of selection. Note: All applicants still in high school who reach their 18th birthday during the nomination year remain eligible if otherwise qualified.

HOW TO ENTER

Scouts should download and submit a completed VFW Scouting Scholarship form, resume of high school activities, scouting record, community service record and letters of recommendation to a local VFW Post no later than March 1. Locate your local Post here.

Note: A Scout can enter through ONE VFW Post only.

HOW IT WORKS

Local VFW Posts submit all candidates with full entry criteria to their respective VFW Department (state) by April 1. From there, the Department selects a winner and forwards the entry to the VFW National Headquarters by May 1 for national-level judging.

Some of our earliest ties to the community involve youth groups and perhaps none are stronger or more lasting than the relationship between the VFW and America's scouting organizations. In fact, our partnership with the Boy Scouts of America dates back to 1915 when VFW Post 2100 helped to establish Troop 1 in Everett, Washington.

Our Scout of the Year program provides members of the Boy Scouts and Girl Scouts who display standout citizenship, patriotism and love of country with the opportunity to be rewarded with college scholarships of up to \$5,000.

Adult Training Opportunities

Behind every successful scout is a good leader. With all the new scouts entering our troop, I thought this would be a great time to mention to the new scout parents that there are a number of ways you can be involved with the troop since your role is now changing. At the Boy Scout level, the troop is boy-led. This can be a hard transition for many of us who are used to being so involved. For that reason, I am going to mention a few training opportunities available for those who are interested in becoming committee members or Assistant Scoutmasters. The first thing you will need is your Youth Protection Training. This is **free** and a great idea for all parents, not just those who plan on serving on committees or camping.




Camp Daniel Boone Pre-Meeting Info

Scouting for Tomorrow

Ever wonder if what you're doing, is important? Take a moment to look at the statistics associated with being a member of this organization. In 2017, 55,494 young men earned the rank of Eagle. Of those, 163 were out of the Gulf Stream Council. Scouting Magazine says just 4% of Boy Scouts earn that rank.

Here are six more interesting facts about former Eagle Scout members.

1. 181 NASA astronauts were involved in Scouting (57.4% of astronauts). 39 are Eagle Scouts.
2. 36.4 percent of the United States Military Academy (West Point) cadets were involved in Scouting as youth. 16.3 percent of cadets are Eagle Scouts.
3. 22.5 percent of United States Air Force Academy cadets were involved in Scouting as youth. 11.9 percent of cadets are Eagle Scouts.
4. 25 percent of United States Naval Academy (Annapolis) midshipmen were involved in Scouting as youth. 11 percent of midshipmen are Eagle Scouts.
5. 189 members of the 113th Congress participated in Scouting as a youth and/or adult leader. 27 are Eagle Scouts.
6. 18 current U.S. governors participated in Scouting as a youth and/or adult volunteer. Four are Eagle Scouts.

Becoming an Eagle isn't everything though. Remember, Bade-Powell's hope was that every boy would achieve the rank of 1st Class Scout. Think about all of the service hours you rank up in that time, think about all the experiences you have and skills you learn. Just being involved in scouting is rewarding, not only for you, but also for your community. More than 8.4 million service hours were reported on Eagle projects alone in 2017. The residual good that all of those hours will do cannot be measured. Think about all the positive things that you have gained, and given, the next time things start to look a little tough, or the road looks a little long. You can get there.





Scholarship

When taking a test, you're supposed to answer the easy questions first. I'm going to apply that same theory to this list of school-related merit badges.

The [Scholarship merit badge](#), where Scouts must show an improvement in their grades and demonstrate good leadership skills at school, is the most obvious inclusion here.

But here's another fact about test-taking: Sometimes the obvious answer is the correct one.




Reading

Scouts who find and read six books from a variety of genres have completed the most time-consuming step for the [Reading merit badge](#).

To find those books, the Scout must work with a merit badge counselor or a librarian — perhaps a school librarian .

My favorite requirement for the Reading MB is the four service hours needed for requirement 4. Scouts could complete that by volunteering at their school library or reading to children.



Theater

Allow me to paraphrase William Shakespeare: All the world's a stage, and the Scouts who are part of the cast or crew of a school musical or play should work concurrently on the [Theater merit badge](#).

That's pretty much what he meant.

While Scouts design sets or costumes, memorize lines, or install stage lighting for a school production, they can check off one requirement after another.

That is, assuming they take the effort to do so. After all, as Shakespeare actually wrote, "it is not in the stars to hold our destiny but in ourselves."




Programming

Choose a sample program and then modify the code or add a function or subroutine to it. Then debug and demonstrate the modified program to your counselor.

That merit badge requirement might sound like gibberish to those of us who grew up in the days of dial-up. But today's teens? They're nodding their heads in understanding.

That's why more and more schools offer classes in computer programming, where students learn skills that employers crave.

It's also why the BSA in 2013 released the [Programming merit badge](#), giving Scouts a STEM-focused introduction to a skill that is both fun and practical.




Athletics

[Athletics merit badge](#) challenges Scouts to improve their performance in activities like running, weightlifting or basketball.

They must show improvement over a three-month period, tracking their progress and using math skills to see how much they've improved.

This merit badge could easily be completed in a season of school sports or semester of PE class.

That is, assuming schools still have PE class.



“We’ve all heard that Scouting experience will give a young person a leg up at a college, university or trade school. But it’s always nice to see tangible proof that this is still the case.

The latest example comes from Andrew, an Eagle Scout from Texas. His proud grandfather, Randy Konkel, noticed that the young man’s acceptance letter from the University of Oklahoma specifically called out Andrew’s Scouting experience.

“While reading your application, we noticed you are an Eagle Scout,” the letter states. “Your commitment and perseverance are to be commended.”

True, the letter from the highly regarded institution in Norman, Okla., doesn’t say that Andrew was accepted solely because he’s an Eagle Scout. His academic record, test scores and involvement in other extracurriculars were big factors, too.

But read the full letter below, and you’ll notice that “Eagle Scout” is the only one of these résumé-builders that’s called out by name. It was important enough to mention specifically, making it clear to Andrew that the time he spent in Scouting mattered.”

These 8 often-overlooked words in every merit badge pamphlet mean a lot

“When Scouts earn merit badges, they get more than a small patch for their merit badge sash. They get hands-on experience in future career paths, college majors and hobbies. They become better-rounded individuals who, like a skilled *Jeopardy!* player, seem to know something about everything. That thought came to mind when I flipped open a merit badge pamphlet recently and saw eight words on the first page. The words were added to pamphlets around 2013, but I hadn’t noticed them before. Perhaps you have overlooked them as well.

The eight words are: “Enhancing our youths’ competitive edge through merit badges.”

Pretty powerful stuff — and a fitting first impression for a title page. The implication is that when young people earn a merit badge — be it one or 100 — they become more competitive in life. That makes them more likely to earn scholarships, land a fulfilling job, or enroll in a good college or trade school.”






